*Low goal tournaments.

(a) **Field Marshal Cariappa Cup (2 Goal).** Out of Hat tournament.

(b) **Baria Cup (4 Goal).** Teams can be entered but it will be compulsory for all teams fielded to have at least one APRC member/JCO/OR/GC/Cdt of the handicap of +1 goal and below. Only one player of handicap +4 and above is allowed to participate.

(c) **DGST Trophy (6 Goal).** Only one player of handicap +4 goal and above is allowed to participate.

2. **Rules.** All tournaments will be played under IPA rules and guidelines. All Polo players are requested to please go through the latest rules issued by the IPA.

3. **Membership of IPA.** The above tournaments are open to teams whose players are playing members of the IPA through a Club or Associations affiliated to the IPA. It is the duty of team managers and captains to ensure that all members of the team fulfil the above conditions failing which a team is liable to be disqualified at any stage. Foreign players need to carry proof of their handicap/umpiring grade from their respective Associations. If a foreign player handicapped by IPA, does not participate in a domestic season for one year and has played abroad in that duration, he will have to play off his handicap in the Country he had last played. Applicable rules of the IPA and the Polo Tournament Committee, APRC will apply on all foreigners.

4. **Foreign Players.** Team Captains of all teams who are arranging for foreign players for their teams during the Delhi Fall Polo Season 2017 are required to forward the details of the foreign players and companions if any as per format enclosed as **Appendix 'A'** along with photocopy of their passport and visa, 20 days prior to start of the season to the APRC, so as to obtain MI Clearance from the concerned authorities. Foreign players whose MI Clearance is delayed for want of submission of details by the Team Captain will **not** be allowed to enter in the Army Equestrian Centre/Army Area. **Request for changes of venue due to non receipt of MI Clearance will not be considered once the draw has been held.**

5. **Registration of Polo Ponies with IPA.** As per the IPA guidelines, all Polo Ponies participating in any polo tournament are required to be registered with the IPA. All team managers and captains will ensure that the polo ponies participating in the Delhi Fall Polo Season 2017 are registered with the IPA before the tournament start and the passport issued by the IPA should be kept with the teams during the season. **Any polo pony found without registration, the player/team shall liable to be disqualified at any stage of the tournament.**

6. **Chukkers.**

(a) **Duration.** Each chukker of the game will comprise of seven minutes.

(b) **Number of Chukkers.**

(i) 12 Goals and below tournaments - 4 chukkers

(ii) 14 Goals Tournaments - 4 chukkers with a 5 chukkers final

(iii) Open Tournaments - 6 chukkers including final.

(c) **Intervals between the Chukkers.** Duration of intervals allowed under IPA Rule G9(a) must be strictly adhered to (ie 3 minutes between chukkers and 5 minutes at half time). Umpires must start the game immediately after the interval, notwithstanding the fact whether all players are present on the play field or not. Time keeper should restart the clock and keep it going after each chukker to display the interval duration.

7. **Date of Submission of Entries.** All entries together with the entry fee for each tournament should reach Secretary, APRC, one week before the scheduled date of commencement of the tournament. However, actual names of players can be given up to 24 hours prior to the start of the tournament. All entries are to be signed by the Team Captain. Once entered the names of team cannot be changed without the permission of the Secretary/Chief Executive, APRC.

8. **Eligibility.**

(a) **Handicap Limit.**

(i) **Handicap Tournaments.** No team with less than 6 goals from the maximum handicap of the tournament would be allowed to participate in IPA Handicap tournament.

(ii) **Open Tournaments.** The open tournaments will be played with the maximum handicap limit of 16 goals and minimum handicap limit of 10 goals.

(b) **Minus Handicap Player.** As per IPA rules **no minus** handicap player would be allowed to participate in any tournament of **12 goals** and above.

(c) **Foreign players participation.** Only one player is eligible to be a part of the team.

9. **Entry Fee.**

(a) Entry fee per team will be as follows :-

(b) **Closing of Entries.** Entries will close **before 12 hours** of the conduct of draw.

(c) **Acceptance of Entries by APRC.** For entry to be accepted by the APRC, the name of at least three members of the team will have to be given and total handicap of those three members must make the team eligible. All team captains must nominate two graded umpires (preferably 'A' grade) from their teams at the time of giving entries.

10. **Draws.** The draws will be conducted by the tournament committee at least 24 hours before the commencement of the tournament. Captains who wish to be present for the draw may attend. The committee reserves the right to seed teams if they feel it is desirable. On arrival, all team captains are requested to contact the Secretary, APRC to receive the draw and other instructions for tournaments. In case two teams are entered under the same name and any request for placing in two different halves, will be considered, however change of players from one team to another will not be permitted. The Polo Tournament committee reserves the right to seed teams in tournaments with handicap of 14 goals and above. Draws are conducted by the Tournament Coordinators with the office bearers and staff of the APRC in attendance. **Once the draws are completed no requests/ representation from teams/players entered for the said tournament will be entertained.**

11. **Subsidiary (Low Goal) Polo Tournaments.** Players/teams entering their names in subsidiary (low goal) tournaments shall be liable to play two games on a given date incase required. No representation with regards to lack of horses/players etc shall be entertained by the APRC.

12. **Withdrawal of the Team from Tournament.** No team is permitted to withdraw/give walkover once the draw for any tournament being played on a league basis has been done. Teams withdrawing can be fined upto Rs 50,000/-, which will have to be paid prior to the teams next match, whether in the same tournament or the subsequent one. Decision of the Tournament Committee would be final in this regard. Teams trying to arrange between them win/losses or goal difference deliberately and surreptitiously will be penalized by the Polo Tournament Committee either by a fine or denial of play in the same/next tournament. Teams must ensure they have adequate horse power to play through the entire tournament, before putting up an entry.

13. **Venue of Play.** The matches will be played at the Army Equestrian Centre (AEC), Delhi Cantt and the Jaipur Polo Ground (JPG), New Delhi. The APRC reserves the right to alter dates/timings of matches on administrative reasons, ground conditions, balance of play, weather sponsors interest, security and safety aspects etc which will dictate the final date and timings of all matches.

14. **Umpires & Referees:-** As per IPA Rules, no team can dispute the nomination of umpires/referees as done by the Tournament Committee (IPA Rule G 7 (c) & (e).)

(a) **Umpires.**

(i) **Nomination of Umpires.** The team captains of each team will nominate players from his team to be detailed for umpiring at the time of the draw itself. Thereafter, the team captain will be informed by the Tournament Coordinators as and when the nominated player from his team is required to umpire a game. If possible no grade "B" Umpire will be nominated for a high goal tournament.

(ii) **Turn Up of Umpires.** During all matches umpires should be ready and should ride out to the centre of the ground two minutes before the game is due to start. Non-reporting of umpire or umpire reporting late for any game will be penalised by a fine of Rs 5,000/- (Rupees five thousand only). The umpire will be banned to take part in the subsequent match/tournament until the Team pays up the amount of Rs 5,000/- to the APRC office at least one day before the team's next match.

(iii) **Dress Code.** Umpires detailed for all games will be strictly adhered to the Dress Code. They must wear knee length brown boots and white breeches (IPA Rule G 11.2). To ensure safety measures, all umpires will be required to wear helmets (not soft caps) while umpiring. Umpires will also present in riding boots and proper attire during prize distribution ceremony. Defaulters will be penalised.

(iv) **Provision of Mounts For the Umpires.** Responsibility to provide mounts to the umpires will be of the two teams playing in any given match. All playing teams will, therefore, bring additional horses for the umpires duly properly equipped and will have gaters/bandages on all four legs in accordance with IPA Field Rules F-4 (iii).

(b) **Referee.** Coordinators of Tournament will detail suitable Referee for all matches who have adequate knowledge of the game. As the task of the Referee in the game is very important, he should, on occasions when he feels that the umpiring is not up to the mark, call and brief the umpires any time, during or after the match. He is also at liberty to brief the umpires before the start of the match so as to ensure smooth conduct of the match.

15. **Professional Umpire/Umpiring Clinic.** The IPA and the APRC are trying to arrange a professional umpire to improve the umpiring standard for the tournaments. A clinic for umpiring has also been planned.

16. **Dress Code.** All players will be required to **strictly adhere to the dress code** on the field and (where applicable) at the time of prize distribution. The Polo Tournament Committee reserves the right to take any suitable action against defaulters. No polo player is allowed to change into track suits/pants etc and come for prize distribution. Team captains/patrons are requested to please ensure the above.

17. **Prize Distribution Ceremony.** To avoid undue delay and embarrassment to the Chief Guest and sponsor, all players are requested to dismount on the ground itself after the finals of every tournament and come straight for the prize distribution. Defaulters will be penalised. The grooms can be directed to come on the ground to hold the horses. The entire prize distribution ceremony will be managed by the Secretary, APRC. Long drawn out ceremonies often have the spectators leaving. The Secretary, APRC along with the sponsor will decide the flow and duration of the prize distribution.

18. **Conduct of Sponsored Tournament/Matches.** Sponsors may require participating teams in any tournament/match, to wear T-shirts and use saddle cloth, bearing the sponsors logo. Teams not prepared to do so may please indicate this at the time of submitting their entries. However once a team agrees to spot a sponsor's logo they must do so for the entire duration of the tournament. Any disputes will be adjudicated upon by the Tournament Committee. The APRC will consider recommendations of the sponsors for nomination of players and officials for exhibition matches but the final decision in this regard would be of the APRC, as the APRC has to satisfy many of its members and will reserve the right to nominate players. No teams or its sponsors are allowed to distribute/display advertising material jeopardizing the main sponsor's interests. Prior permission of the Chief Executive/Secretary, APRC will be taken in this regard and the decision would be final. The APRC within its 20% space will be at full liberty to put up hoarding/kiosks at its discretion. Teams/sponsors are requested to liaise with Secretary, APRC in this regard. The sponsor/team cannot display kiosks/display material etc without the permission of the Secretary, APRC.

19. **Polo Etiquette and Decorum.** Misbehaving with other players and umpires on the polo field will be strictly dealt with. All players are advised to display true spirit of sportsmanship and ensure gentlemanly conduct on the ground. Stern action will be taken against the defaulters including complete ban from all polo activity for upto one year. The Polo Tournament Committee shall be the final authority for imposing a disciplinary action/fine on any player/team found not following proper polo etiquette and decorum. **No players/members or anyone associated with any team can approach any of the match officials for atleast 45 minutes after the match is over. The officials shall be not liable to give any kind of explanation of the events either.**

20. **Holding and Return of Cups/Trophies.** Trophies/Cups won by the teams will be returned to the APRC.

21. **Objections.** All objections or any point which arise that are not covered by the above Rules may be referred to the Polo Tournament Committee along with a fee of Rs 3,000/-. The decision of the Tournament Committee will be final.

22. **Camp.** Camping facilities for out station horses are made available at the Army Equestrian Centre, Delhi Cantt for the duration of the Delhi Fall Polo Season - 2017. Permission to stable horses during the above period is subject to certain conditions and payment of security deposit as laid down in **Appendix 'B'** to this Prospectus. Security aspects as mentioned in Paragraphs 6 to 8 of Annexure II to Appx 'B' pertaining to civilian employees of all contingents including APRC members entering the Army Equestrian Centre for temporary stabling will be strictly adhered to. No civilian employee of any contingent will be allowed to enter the Army Equestrian Centre without civil police verification. **Contingents/individual who had not cleared their earlier dues will not be allowed to camp their horses at Army Equestrian Centre, Delhi.**

23. **Self Containment.** All teams coming to participate in the Delhi Fall Polo Season 2017 must be self-contained, ie, they should bring their own tentage, equipment for camping, cooks and transport, etc. Any contingent requiring camping stables at the premises may contact 2IC, Army Equestrian Centre.

24. **Ration/Fodder.** Army contingents are advised to bring maximum quantity of grain/fodder to sustain their horses during their stay in Delhi or, they can ask for attachment with the local Supply Depot. Other contingents are advised to make their own arrangements for animal rations. However, animal rations and hay can be procured on cash payment.

25. **Arboriculture.** No Det/Camp will spoil or cut the environment. Immediate expulsion and action as per existing law will be enforced. **No warning will be issued.**

26. **Coggin's and Glanders Test.** All rules and instructions issued from the IPA and Remount Veterinary Directorate, IHQ on the subject will be strictly adhered to by all concerned. All horses must produce a valid negative EIA and Glander status (CFT) certificate on arrival as per directions given at Para 5(a) of **Appendix 'B'** to this Prospectus. A coggins and glanders negative certificate with a minimum of 15 days validity on arrival and exit of horses is mandatory.

27. **Veterinary Commission.** The Veterinary Commission detailed by the IHQ of MoD (Army), QMG's Branch along with representative of the Animal Husbandry Commissioner for the Delhi Polo Tournament will have full right to examine all the horses participating. It is advisable to have horses checked by the Veterinary Officer on duty before play, more so if the horse is required to play a second chukker. For your information, as per established practice, no APRC horse is allowed to be doubled.

28. **Veterinary Doctors.** The following vet doctors are available in case of an emergency.

29. **Medical Cover.** The APRC will as usual provide medical cover for players at the ground. The APRC shall not accept any liability for medical treatment given to a player on the ground or the consequences thereof. It will be the responsibility of the individual to give a written undertaking absolving the APRC of any responsibility in this regard. Specimen of the declaration to be given by all playing members is as per **Appendix 'C'** to this Prospectus. The APRC will only provide first aid emergency treatment as well as evacuation to the hospital where necessary, though every possible available medical cover will be presented.

30. **Insurance Cover.** It is recommended that all players/individual take insurance against any injury sustained while playing polo whether at the Jaipur Polo Ground or Army Equestrian Centre Grounds or while riding at the Army Equestrian Centre. It would be ideal for the ponies as well to be covered under some insurance policy. The APRC may be informed as regard the above while signing the medical declaration. The APRC excludes all liability for any injury and/or loss occasioned to any person and/or their property within the premises of Jaipur Polo Ground, New Delhi and Army Equestrian Centre, Delhi Cantt.

31. **Responsibility.** The APRC accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury to any animal or any other property or the player/rider themselves. Neither the APRC nor the Doctor will be held responsible for any first aid or other medical treatment provided.

32. **Rail Freight.** No rail freight for ponies, rail fare or, DA will be paid by the APRC to any player/attendant.

33. **Truck Carriage.** The APRC will be pleased to offer names of trucking companies at competitive rates for carriage of horses to and fro from the match venue.

34. **Final Decision.** The decision of the Tournament Committee will be final on all matters connected with a tournament.

RULES AND REGULATIONS : TEMPORARY STABLING FACILITY
ARMY EQUESTRIAN CENTRE, (AEC), DELHI CANTT

1. **Eligibility.** The camping facility at Army Equestrian Centre will only authorize to those who are **either member of Indian Polo Association or Equestrian Federation of India.**
2. **Security.** The AEC is located on defence land, hence there is a need to be extra cautious on the aspects of security. All Defence/Para Military contingents, private horse owners and APRC members are hereby instructed to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations. Any violation of these instructions would render the concerned contingent liable to be asked to vacate the AEC premises forthwith.
3. Entry and stabling within the AEC will be regulated by the Officer-in-Charge of AEC. Contingents Cdr/Private horse owners/APRC members will be personally responsible to ensure that only specified area is utilised for camping, stabling and riding. All contingents Cdr/Private horse owners/APRC members will render a list of personnel attached/employed with respective teams alongwith the request for temporary stabling. The following details will be included :-
 - (a) Police verification in respect of civil employees.
 - (b) Two passport size photographs of civil employees.
4. **Duration.** Temporary stabling facilities at the AEC may be provided as per policy governing stabling at AEC. The duration of stabling would be with reference to the Polo/Equestrian activities.
5. **Procedure**
 - (a) **For entry to AEC.** All Defence/Para Military contingents, private horse owners and APRC members will render an application as per format attached at Annexure I, 15 days before the arrival of the team at the AEC/ date from which temporary stabling is intended at the AEC. These applications will be addressed to OIC, AEC, B Squadron 61 Cavalry, Delhi Cantt. Documents as mentioned in para 2 above, for all civilian employees, will be enclosed by all private horse owners/ APRC members applying for temporary stabling. The following documents will be produced by all Defence/ Para Military Contingents, private horse owners and APRC members:-
 - (i) Coggins and Glanders negative certificate valid for a minimum of 15 days at the time of entry.
 - (ii) Valid movement order for Army teams.
 - (iii) Certificate/affidavit duly completed as attached at Annexure II.
 - (iv) Passport issued by IPA/EFI.
 - (b) Without above mentioned documents the horses will not be permitted for entering in the AEC stables.
 - (c) **For exit from the AEC.** The following documents will be produced by all Defence/ Para Military contingents, private horse owners and APRC members:-
 - (i) Coggins and Glanders Negative certificate valid for minimum of 15 days at the time of exit.
 - (ii) No demand certificate issued by the OIC AEC.
6. **Administration.** Local administration will be under the overall supervision of the OIC, AEC. The salient features of the terms and conditions for effective administration are listed below for strict adherence:-
 - (a) Temporary stabling will only be permitted in the area specified by OIC AEC. No permanent structures will be constructed.
 - (b) Camping area for respective contingents will be specified by the OIC AEC. Only tentage will be utilised for camping for men.

- (c) Separate area will be earmarked for dumping of hay and litter. The contingent commander will ensure dumping in the nominated area. no hay/litter will be disposed near stabling/ camping area.
- (d) Nominated water troughs will be utilised. Timings as per local orders will be strictly adhered to. Sick horses will not be watered at the trough.
- (e) No contingent will tap electricity.
- (f) Entry and exit of vehicles in to the AEC will only be through the main gate. All vehicles will stop at the main gate for checking and verification.
- (g) Daily orders of local administration will only be pasted on the notice boards at the main gate and the Asiad Tower. No individual communication in this regard will be made.
- (h) Contingent commanders will earmark personnel for collective area cleaning as per timings which will be intimated daily on the Notice Boards.
- (j) Cooking on wood fires is not permitted.

7. **Arboriculture.** All contingents will plant maximum trees in the area as specified by the OIC AEC. Free saplings will be given to every contingent for plantation and maintenance thereafter. No one will cut trees/ branches in the area. Immediate eviction will be resorted to if any case comes to light. No horses will be tied to trees. No support of trees will be taken. No Det/Camp will spoil or cut the environ. Immediate expulsion and action as per exiting law will be enforced.

8. **Discipline.** No liquor is permitted within the AEC. Intoxication, assault or affray will be viewed very seriously and will result in the individual being expelled immediately.

9. **Jurisdiction.** The responsibility as regard safety of men, material and horses is that of the owner. No claim can be made against the camp authorities.

10. **Fire Discipline.** No one is allowed to light fires or smoke within the stabling area. All detachments will be self sufficient in the following:-

- (a) Sand bucket : Two
- (b) Water Bucket (20 ltrs) : Two
- (c) Shovel : Two

11. **Leasing of Horses.** No private horse owner/contingent will lease out their horses to any individual for daily riding purposes. Any one found indulging in running a private set up would be liable for strict disciplinary action.

12. **Security Deposit.** All contingents temporarily stabling at the Army Equestrian Centre will pay refundable Security Deposit prior to setting up camp as under. The amount is returned after inspecting the camp area by the ZIC, AEC :-

- (a) For Defence/Para Military Rs 5,000/- per camp
- (b) Civil Camps Rs 10,000/- per camp

13. All horse owners/Army contingents who require to stable their horses at the AEC must process their permission from the AEC office in advance.

14. **Conclusion.** The above rules and regulations clearly lay down the guidelines governing the temporary stabling facility provided at the AEC. The AEC a facility of the Army and no Defence/ Para Military contingents, private horse owners and the APRC members has any right on to allow him/them to take claims over this land. The OIC AEC reserves the rights to remove all horses, men and material without any notice.
